Shopping Checklist

- Baking soda
- Dish soap
- White vinegar
- Borax
- 3% Hydrogen peroxide
- Lemon juice
- Spray bottle

Important Tips

- Do not reuse spray bottles that held commercial cleaning products. The residues can create hazardous byproducts.
- Always read product labels to determine how to properly use the product

A WARNING

Tub & Tile Cleaner

Create a paste of the following ingredients and use to scrub tiles or your tub with a sponge

- 1 cup baking soda
- · Warm water as needed



Toilet Bowl Cleaner

Create a paste of the following ingredients to clean your toilet bowl.

- Borax
- Lemon juice



Oven Cleaner

Remove the oven racks and crumbs, etc. Spread baking soda on the floor of the oven. Spray with water until it forms a paste. Leave overnight (it will turn brown). Remove in the morning with a sponge. Repeat if necessary.

- Baking soda
- water



All Purpose Cleaner

Mix water and vinegar in a spray bottle. Use to clean the kitchen sink, kitchen counters, and inside of the fridge.

**Great for removing mold/mildew



- · 1 cup white vinegar
- 1 cup water

Carpet Deodorizer

This is a great way to remove unwanted odors from your carpet. Sprinkle baking soda on your carpet and let it sit for 15 minutes before vacuuming it up.

Window & Mirror Cleaner

Mix the following ingredients in a spray bottle and use in place of commercial window cleaner. Makes 3.5 cups

- 3 cups water, preferably distilled
- ½ cup white vinegar
- · 1 tsp dish soap
