WHAT IS HAZARDOUS WASTE?

According to the EPA, each US household produces an average of 20 lbs. of hazardous waste per year, for a total of 530,000 tons! Improper disposal can harm sanitation workers, pollute drinking water and harm the environment. That's why it is important to minimize the use of hazardous materials and dispose of it properly.

A product is considered hazardous when it has one or more of the following properties:

- Flammable/combustible: Can easily be ignited
- Explosive/reactive: Can detonate or explode through exposure to heat, sudden shock or pressure
- Corrosive/caustic: Can burn and destroy living tissue
- *Toxic/poisonous*: Capable of causing injury or death through ingestion, inhalation, or absorption
- Radioactive: Can damage and destroy cells and chromosomal material
